

Frequently Asked Questions About The Half Century of Progress Show

HOURS... What hours are the gates open?

7:00 a.m. to dusk, but on Thursday and Saturday nights gates will close after the tractor pull.

ADMISSION--- What does it cost to get in?

Adults, \$15 per day... \$30 for a 4-day pass.

Children, 12 and under, are free

GOLF CARTS AND ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES... May I bring my own?

Yes, but there is a \$30 tag fee, good for all days of the show. There is a 5 mph restriction for all vehicles on the grounds, tractors included. Please help us maintain that. No drivers are permitted under 16 years of age for all vehicles on the grounds, including tractors.

RENTING A GOLF CART... Can I reserve one?

VEHICLE RESTRICTIONS... May I ride a motorcycle or bicycle?

Sorry, bicycles, motorcycles and mopeds are not permitted on the grounds.

CAMPING... Can we park our camper at the show?

An exhibitor or vendor may find dry camper parking within the show grounds for a cost of \$40, good for the entire show, beginning Monday morning, August 24, 2017. Others with campers may find a spot at nearby campgrounds.

MY BUDDY, OLD SHEP... May I bring my dog to the show?

It really is not advisable, but we understand the bond you might have with your buddy. If you bring your dog in, you must keep your pet on a leash at all times within the show grounds. It really is best, though, to not have pets at the show.

MY PLOW, MY COMBINE, MY PICKER... Will I be able to work them at Rantoul?

We hope you will bring your equipment for display and demonstration. Please remember, though, this is a demonstration show. As big as our space is we will need to wait to take turns in the fields, and there will be a limited number of rounds that can be made simply because others want that opportunity too. There is no need for speed. Please take your time and enjoy these memorable hours at the show. Your kind, cordial cooperation with the field marshals will be appreciated.

REGISTRATION... Will I need to register my tractor?

Yes, please take time to do that at Hangar 2. You will receive a special keepsake badge for registering. And, if you plan to operate your equipment at the show, you must attend either a morning or afternoon safety training session in Hangar 2.
